early 100 years

ago to the day, the majestic RMS Titanic set sail on its maiden voyage from South Hampton, UK to New York City. It never arrived on our Eastern seacoast. Nearly 15 years ago James Cameron filmed his movie "Titanic," following the events that took place that cold night in 1912. The movie's recent release in 3D, in addition to the anniversary, has brought Titanic to the forefront of many people's imaginations again, including my own.

Years ago, I distinctly remember sitting in the dark theater as the main character, Rose, sat on a plank of wood from the Titanic's wreckage after the ship had sunk and watched Jack sink slowly into the dark waters of the Atlantic. The people behind me wailed in tears, blowing their noses often.

As an historical event, the event was truly tragic, although as a movie goer, I admit to laughing a bit at the teary eyed folk around me who were so engrossed in the scene that they convulsed as they sobbed.

Poor Jack. It was only until after Jack vanished into the depths, that I myself became a little emotional. I wasn't sad. I was sort of angry. Annoyed

even. I remember thinking about that plank. Wasn't that plank that Rose was floating on plenty big enough for both her and Jack? Of course it was! Why didn't she let him on? Selfish woman! She killed Jack! She's responsible. Move over, Rose!

Roses' fault. Perhaps the plank really wasn't big enough to fit both of them. Perhaps the plank would have sunk under the weight of both individuals. I've submitted this scene to the Discovery Channel's "Mythbusters" to test what would have happened had Jack tried to climb aboard. Look for my episode soon. Until they test it, I guess we'll never know what would have happened.

It occurs to me that that Titanic scene is analogous to what often happens in churches all over America, perhaps even here at Lakeview Baptist. We're like Rose. We're safe, comfortable, and secure. We sit securely on our little plank (the land that the church sits on) and there are hundreds, perhaps thousands of unchurched people ("Jacks") flailing about in the vast ocean of our communities looking for shelter and belonging that we can provide, but we (Rose) won't let them on the plank.

We might claim in our mission statement that we desire to

save "Jacks", but by our actions, we often let them drown.

Perhaps we should sympathize with Rose's character a bit. Do vou know how inconvenient it would be for Rose to have let Jack on board? She would have to move over and give him space to live and breath and To be fair, it may not have been function. She might have to give up her preferred posture on the plank. She might have to sacrifice being a bit cold by letting a leg dangle into the water if that would offset a lack of buoyancy. She would have to risk being overwhelmed as other people who saw what Jack was doing may also try to climb on board, perhaps sinking the whole operation. Perhaps letting him drown was just easier than helping him on board.

> Were those fake tears she cried for Jack?

It's the same thing with churches.

If "Jacks" got on board, we might have to move over a bit. We may have to sit in different pews than we're used to.

Things might get uncomfortable when "Jacks" don't dress like we want them to.

A bunch of "Jacks" might take up a lot of resources at first and risk sinking the budget.

Our preferences might have to be blown out of the water. What if we find out "Jacks" like loud music or like to dance

when they sing? What if they don't like singing at all?

What if "Jacks" try to do things the way we've never done them around here before? That might make those already on the plank upset.

"Jacks" might make life on the plank less predictable.

"Jacks" might scuff up memorialized items.

"Jacks" might be a bit strange.

"Jacks" might swear in front of our children.

"Jacks" might make the plank not seem like "family" anymore. "Us four and no more," as some say.

And so we don't help them (or even let them) onto the plank.

And... they drown.

They descend into a Christ-less eternity.

Why? Because it's easier than helping them on board.

It's too costly for us to save them, not in terms of money, but in terms of energy, inconvenience, our comfort and our preferences. Perhaps we're not willing to "move over" and give other people space and ownership.

As I watched the movie, as I'm sure was the case in real life, every few seconds, someone slipped underneath the water and slowly drowned. 1500+ people perished as people on planks (and even those in half-full life boats) failed to act.

We can't fail to act. The stakes are too high. Eternity is too long.

Move over. Let someone on board. In fact, why not even invite them?


## KIDS DIVE DEEP INTO GOD'S WORD AT VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL

#### **SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE**




